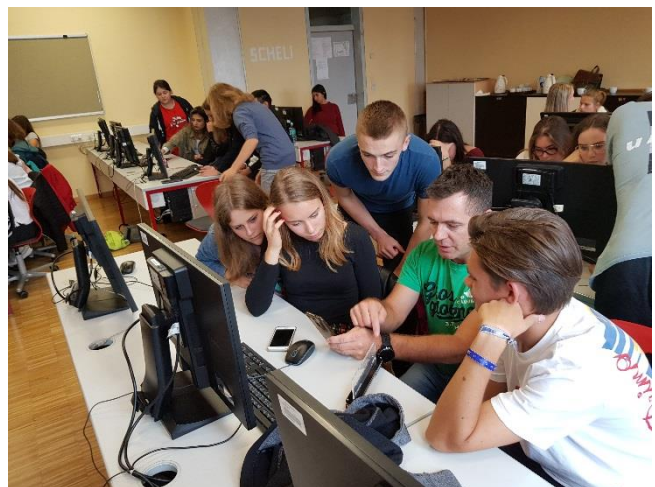


## Internationales Erasmus-Treffen in Klagenfurt

Zum Erasmustreffen des „MobileApp“-Projektes konnte Projektkoordinatorin Elisabeth Grumet letzte Woche Schüler und Lehrer aus Spanien, Polen und der Türkei bei uns in Klagenfurt begrüßen.



Alle Gäste kamen nach langer Anreise per Flugzeug bzw. Zug schon am Sonntag in Klagenfurt an. Der erste Projekttag begann dann mit der Begrüßung durch den Direktor und Präsentationen über die HTL und über Kärnten. Danach führten wir die Gäste durch die Schule und die Werkstätten, wo die Schüler dann auch gleich selbst aktiv werden konnten und unter Mithilfe der österreichischen Schüler ein Werkstück löteten. Dieses Werkstück mit einem RGB LED-Streifen und einem vom Laserprinter gefertigten Aufsatz wurde dann am Donnerstag beim MobileApp-Workshop zum Programmieren einer App verwendet, mit der diese Lichtelemente über Bluetooth gesteuert werden können. Bei diesem von Alexander Rodiga betreutem Workshop lernten die ausländischen Schüler Einiges über App-Programmierung und auch Einiges über die spezielle technische Ausbildung an unserer Schule.



Natürlich gab es für die Gäste auch ein Besichtigungsprogramm. Die Innenstadt von Klagenfurt konnten sie in einer City-Rally selbst erkunden, ein Ausflug nach Hochosterwitz und Maria Wörth wurde mit einer Wörtherseerundfahrt bei herrlichem Sonnenschein kombiniert und nach unserer Exkursion nach Graz konnten die Gäste bei einem Besuch in der Zotter Schokoladenfabrik noch köstliche Schokolade verkosten. Auch Minimundus stand am Programm, wo natürlich die Miniaturen der Sehenswürdigkeiten der Projektländer von besonderem Interesse waren, und als besonderes Highlight besuchten wir das Kunstprojekt „For Forest“ im Wörtherseestadium, von dem einige Gäste schon aus der Presse ihrer Heimatländer erfahren hatten.



Den Abschlussabend feierten wir bei einer von Elke Rieken organisierten Grillerei an der Schule, zu der auch die Gastfamilien mit Salaten und Kuchen ihren Beitrag leisteten.
